Governor News

At the end of this term Janet Crooks will be standing down as a governor after nearly six years in the role; her contribution deserves special mention. With school finances under pressure like never before, it's impossible to overstate just how important Janet's work as a finance link governor and chair of the resources committee has been. The fact that Horspath School's finances are relatively healthy in comparison with many other schools around the country is not because we receive more money than they do (if anything, we receive less); it is because of good financial management in school and detailed financial oversight from Janet. Janet's attention to detail has also been invaluable to the achievements and standards committee, spending many hours studying data to ensure the school is held to account for the progress of every single pupil. The introduction of the new Pupil Tracker system was, in part, driven by Janet's advocacy of the need to be able to see a child's progress across their entire school career.

Over the last few years, the role of a school governor has changed. It is no longer enough to be well-meaning volunteer; it requires professionalism, expertise and dedication. Janet has consistently brought all three of these and has been a major factor in transforming the governing body into the professional, effective team that it is now.

As a school governor with strategic oversight of the school and little involvement in day-to-day operations, it's not uncommon sometimes to ask yourself "have I made a difference?" Janet should leave us with no doubts at all in this regard - her contributions have benefited every single child who has been at the school in the last six years, and the impact of her work will continue to be felt for many years to come.

Curriculum

School shoes need to be black leather or synthetic leather. They do need to be waterproof, including the upper surface, so the hybrid trainer/school shoe with the fabric side and top are not suitable. If you haven't taught your child to do up laces yet then please go for the Velcro options. Children are welcome to wear boots or wellies to and from school in winter but they do need black school shoes for the school day. Acorn class has a selection of wellies for outdoor play.

Please check your child's shoes regularly, the "I've got to wear my trainers because my school shoes don't fit/are broken/lost" excuse has a very short time limit!
